Greetings from all of us at shuktara homes. We have just celebrated the festival of Holi, which you will know involves paint and water and lots of smiles. This year Pappu made sure that we had chemical free colours and everyone enjoyed the day.

You may remember from previous news that just after Christmas 2019, I was awarded the British Empire Medal, for which I have to thank our supporter Patrick Tissington in cahoots with Sue Tungay, who gave him some details which he forwarded to the relevant Government Departments. Pappu, chairman of shuktara here in Kolkata was delighted with the news and thinks it will help in terms of people getting to know about his work here with the young people. As yet, it has not been awarded, but the BEM is given in the local town hall of one's residence by the Lord Lieutenant of said county. Kingston Town Hall did not push my buttons, so I have been in touch with the British Deputy High Commissioner in Kolkata to see if I can be awarded here with the shuktara family in attendance.



On the 1st March we took the keys for a small ground floor flat with wheelchair access just around the corner from Lula Bari. For a long time we have wanted to have a separate stitching centre for the girls, where Nandita can work with them. This seems like the perfect place. It also means that the girls can come and go from Lula Bari during the day rather than stay in one place, especially now that most of the older ones have finished at school. We can take on work as well from people to give the girls a personal income.

It's an exciting time for all of us and especially Prity, who is really looking forward to it. Nandita is now back with us full time and we have named the stitching centre Anjali Bari, in memory of Tookie Mashi (who died in 2018) as her proper name was Anjali Singh. This is a fitting memorial to her. We have also taken on a new carer at Lula Bari, bringing the total number of staff to 7 for 7 girls! Minu Mondal is settling in well as a full time carer and is especially good with Tamina. (Minu in photo above with Guria and Tamina)






